No youth under the age of 14 years old may attend.

Read the class descriptions very carefully and be aware of the **weaving level**, **length of class time**, **class price** and any **special tools** needed to complete the basket. Some classes encompass several hours over two days. Be careful not to double book your time. Fill in your registration form completely. <u>ALL</u> information requested must be filled out legibly to ensure your registration is not confused with someone else and so that we can contact you if a question should arise.

When you fill in your class requests, please make sure the numbers of your classes are legible and that you have listed 2nd and 3rd choices in case your 1st choice class is full. <u>You</u> must enter at least three choices for each day you plan on weaving. Not listing three choices may affect your registration.

Registration is on a first come first serve basis <u>for</u> <u>the first 130 registrants</u> and <u>May 1, 2024 is the</u> <u>registration deadline.</u> With your registration, <u>send in</u> <u>separate checks for each of your 1st choice classes.</u> <u>Make these checks payable to the teacher of that</u> <u>class.</u> You must write separate checks for <u>each</u> <u>class.</u> These checks, made out to the teacher of each class should be dated for June 25, 2024.

Lodging and General Information

Room reservations MUST be made through the General Butler Resort State Park by calling 866-462-8853 and identifying yourself as a member of the Bluegrass Area Basketmakers, **group #6143** Reservation deadline is Friday, May 24, 2024. All reservations must be guaranteed with a major credit card. Any reservation cancelled less than 48 hours prior to the day of arrival may be charged one night's room fee and tax.

Over 100 Campground and RV sites are available. Reservations for camp/RV sites must be made through Reserve America at

ALL accommodations are NON-SMOKING. There will be a strict enforcement of this policy. There will be a \$100.00 fee added to the room/cottage charge of any accommodation in which smoking has occurred. The fee covers the cleaning cost required to return the accommodation to a smoke free environment. Smoking is only allowed outdoors.

No food and drink purchased outside the Park are allowed in the Conference Center building where classes are held. There is a restaurant on site for all your meals. All meals will be on your own. We are working with the Park to insure that the restaurant is open for times that fit our weaving schedule and we will provide that information when you arrive at the Seminar. There are also fast-food places within 3 miles of the Park. A list of these restaurants will be included with your welcome book. <u>Absolutely no cooking</u> in the Lodge rooms or on their balconies (this includes hot plates and crock pots etc.) The cottages are equipped with a kitchen and refrigerator for your use.

All times listed are in the Eastern Time Zone.

Check List

Bring tools such as pencils, measuring tape, sharp scissors, container for water (large enough to hold your reed), spring type clothes pins, sharp knife, awl or screwdriver, extra hand towel, spray bottle, and pliers. Again, pay attention to special tools needed for your basket, if requested by the teacher. If you have difficulty seeing, you might consider bringing a high-intensity light (Ott Lite) and an extension cord.

Skill Level Guide

Beginner/All Levels: for those who are learning basic skills and above. Basic skills include start/stop weaving, twining, and starting a base.

Intermediate: for those who have some experience in start/stop, over/under weaving, twining, setting up a base, and doing a basic rim.

Advanced: for those who have mastered the basic skills and are ready to try new techniques and/or other creative methods.

30 years. She has taught at NCBA, GBA, Guilders Weave, KBA, Bluegrass, MBO, Odyssey, Oklahoma, Stateline, Stowe and TBA conventions, seminars and for her local Port City Guild. She loves to stimulate the interest of basket weaving and sharing tips with others

while also learning new tips from her students. She considers herself a non-traditional Nantucket weaver as she finds common things to use as molds for classes and usually incorporates a twill weave into the baskets.

Anne Bowers - Anne is from the Eastern Panhandle of West



Virginia where she works in her studio designing and teaching baskets. She was a production basket maker for many years, and she brings those skills into each basket that she teaches. Ribbed basketry is her specialty, and some of her baskets have taken on a

sculptural perspective in recent years. In 2023 she attended the World Wicker and Weaving Festival in Poznan, Poland. She taught at the 2023 National Basketry Organization Conference in Takoma, WA. She has taught on 4 basketry cruises, teaches basketry widely and lectures about the woven form. She is in her 43rd year of weaving which still fascinates her. She is thrilled that her first book, "Ribbed Basketry: Traditional to Contemporary", is finally in print. This coming fall will mark her 35t^h year of participation in the annual Over the Mountain Studio Tour. Her goal is to make each student's class a successful one.

Sandy Bulgrin - Sandy has been teaching basket weaving for



over 35 years, having started by instructing 4-H children, which she continues today. Sandy enjoys teaching at the museums in her area along with many continuing education programs in the schools in Wisconsin and Illinois. She has taught at many of the state's basket events, gourd events and retreats. Sandy also organizes the Basket Weaving Cruise.

with four daughters. In 1985 she opened Atkinson's Country House to teach/sell supplies. It is now a nationwide mail order company. basket programs to YouTube. Sandy loves to teach, sharing this art form in over 26 states. She has a basket studio in Lennon, Michigan where she and husband Steve live on small farm. They have eight grandchildren.

Steve Atkinson - Steve Atkinson worked for GM 34 years,



retiring in 2000 then joined his wife at Atkinson's Country House full time. Steve took up woodcutting. He coached 34 years at high school level. Although his favorite sport is football, Steve has coached boys' basketball, girls' basketball, volleyball, baseball, softball,

having undefeated teams. He took up seat weaving several years ago and really enjoys creating new patterns to weave. He builds all his own frames. Steve continues working at basket studio in Lennon, Michigan on a small farm, he has eight grandchildren.

Nettia is all about drama. The basket begins with a 5" acrylic bloom base in shades of purple and blue. The round reed spokes will be secured with twining and 4-rod wale. The sides capture the attention with "ribbon spokes" that also play an important role in

the creation of the "Circle" border. Some unique round reed techniques will be discussed and utilized as well as traditional weaving methods. **8.5 x 4.7 Special tools: bent nose pliers.**

Students will start with a cleaned and prepped gourd that we will cover with a batik design using my unique resist and dye technique. I will have an array of colors to choose from. I will show how to design on a round surface and I will have a variety of Hawaiian patterns to use or you can create

your own... this class is fun! We will then coil the top with linen and banyan tree aerial roots from Hilo, Hawaii. To finish it off I will show students how to make my signature philodendron rose for the rim. I will also go over how to clean and prep the gourds so students can make more. This class is always a hit with students and it doesn't take a lot of brain power!



Thankful starts by weaving a filled base on a 6" x 20" D handle. Techniques include start/stop weaving, twining, continuous weave, and the use of overlays. There will be an emphasis on shaping. The accent colors are smoked, gold, and celery green. Shaker tape and sea grass are woven in this basket as accents – lots of texture! A colorful fall floral sprig and ribbon adorn the front. There is a

pop of color in the rim. This basket is sure to become a favorite! 8 ¹/₂ x 10 ¹/₂ x 20 with handle. Special tools: spoke weight.
